

**Village of Rosemary  
In the Province of Alberta  
By-Law # 425/11**

A Bylaw of the Village of Rosemary in the Province of Alberta for the purpose of regulating highway traffic.

**WHEREAS** the Council of the Village of Rosemary has the authority, under Section 191 of the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, c-M26 and related amendments, to enact Bylaws not inconsistent with the Traffic Safety Act concerning highways under its' direction, control and management;

**NOW THEREFORE** pursuant to the Traffic Safety Act, R.S.A. 2000, c T-6 the Village of Rosemary enacts as follows:

**1.0    TITLE**

1.1    This Bylaw may be cited as the **"Village of Rosemary Traffic Bylaw"**.

**2.0    DEFINITIONS**

2.1    For the purpose of interpretation, this Bylaw accepts and encompasses all definitions as set out in the Act, and all such definitions in that section shall apply to those terms when used in the Bylaw.

2.1    Notwithstanding Section 2.1 above:

2.1.1    **"Act"** means the Traffic Safety Act, R.S.A. 2000, cT-6, as amended or replaced from time to time;

2.1.2    **"Bylaw"** means the Village of Rosemary Traffic Bylaw No.425/11 as maybe amended from time to time;

2.1.3    **"Chief Administrative Officer (CAO)"** means the Chief Administrative Officer of the Village of Rosemary regardless of any subsequent title that may be conferred on that officer by Council or statute, or his designate;

2.1.4    **"Council"** means the Municipal Council of the Village of Rosemary;

2.1.5    **"Gross Vehicle Weight"** shall mean the aggregate weight of the unloaded vehicle and the weight of the load which that vehicle is licensed to carry for the purpose of enforcing this Bylaw. The terms "GVW", "Gross Vehicle Weight", "Licensed Mass", "Licensed Maximum Gross Weight", "Maximum Gross Weight", and "Registered Weight" shall carry the same meaning;

2.1.6    **"Heavy Vehicle"** shall mean a public vehicle, with or without load that exceeds any ONE of the following: A gross vehicle weight in excess of 7,500 kilograms, or an overall length, inclusive of any attached commercial trailer, of 7.0 meters, or an overall height of 2.74 meters;

- 2.1.7 **“Highway”** means any thoroughfare, street, road, trail, avenue, parkway, driveway, viaduct, lane, alley, square, bridge, causeway, trestle way or other place or any part of any of them, whether publicly or privately owned, that the public is ordinarily entitled or permitted to use for the passage or parking of vehicles and includes a sidewalk, including a boulevard adjacent to the sidewalk, if a ditch lies adjacent to and parallel with the roadway, the ditch, and if a highway right of way is contained between fences or between a fence and one side of the roadway, all the land between the fences, or all the land between the fence and the edge of the roadway, as the case may be, but does not include a place declared by regulation not to be a highway as defined in the Act;
- 2.1.8 **“Loading Zone”** shall mean that portion of a street adjacent to the curb or the side of street so designated for the exclusive use of vehicles loading or unloading of goods or passengers;
- 2.1.9 **“Off-Highway Vehicle”** shall have the same meaning as “Off-Highway Vehicle” as defined in The Traffic Safety Act, R. |S.A. 2000, cT-6, as amended or replaced from time to time;
- 2.1.10 **“Passenger Zone”** shall mean any space on a street designated for the loading or unloading of passengers only;
- 2.1.11 **“Peace Officer”** means a Bylaw Enforcement Officer appointed by the Village of Rosemary pursuant to Section 555 of the Municipal Government Act and for the purpose of enforcement of this Bylaw, also includes a Community Peace Officer under contract with another municipality or a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police;
- 2.1.12 **“Public Vehicle”** shall have the same meaning as “Private Passenger Vehicle” as defined in The Traffic Safety Act, R. |S.A. 2000, cT-6, as amended or replaced from time to time;
- 2.1.13 **“Recreation Vehicle”** shall mean a vehicle or combination of a vehicle and trailer designated for vacation, camping or similar recreation purposes and shall include light trailers designed for hauling watercraft, snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles, etc.;
- 2.1.14 **“Registrar”** means the Registrar of the Motor Vehicles Division of the Department of the Solicitor General and, for the purposes of signing a certificate as required in subsection 238(4) of the Criminal Code (Canada), or a deputy Registrar;
- 2.1.15 **“School Patrol”** shall mean any authorized member of a school patrol program of the Grasslands School Division controlling an intersection or crosswalk being used by students;
- 2.1.16 **“Tare Weight”** shall mean the weight of the vehicle when it is not carrying a load;
- 2.1.17 **“Traffic Control Device”** shall have the same meaning as defined in the Act, as amended or replaced from time to time;
- 2.1.18 **“Village”** means the Village of Rosemary, a Municipal Corporation in the Province of Alberta, or the geographical area contained within the boundaries of the Village of Rosemary, as the context may require;
- 2.1.19 **“Violation Tag”** means a tag or similar document issued by the Village pursuant to the Act;

2.1.20 **“Violation Ticket”** means a ticket issued pursuant to Part II of the Provincial Offences Procedures Act, R.S.A. 2000, c P-34, as amended and any Regulations thereto.

### **3.0 AUTHORITY OF CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER**

3.1 The Council of the Village of Rosemary hereby delegates to the Chief Administrative Officer power to prescribe where traffic control devices are to be located. The Council directs the Chief Administrative Officer to maintain a record of such locations and that record shall be made available to the public during normal office hours.

3.2 Without restricting the generality of the above subsection (3.1), the Chief Administrative Officer is authorized to:

3.2.1 Designate playground zones, school zones, safety zones, passenger and loading zones and cause the same to be marked with signs or pavement marking or both;

3.2.2 Designate those intersections where right turns, left turns, U-turns, or any turns are prohibited and shall cause those intersections to be marked with signs;

3.2.3 Designate those areas where angle parking or parallel parking is permitted for a specified period of time or where parking is prohibited and shall cause those areas to be marked with signs, curb or pavement markings, or both;

3.2.4 Designate any street as one which is closed temporally in whole or in part and shall cause such street to be marked by signs or suitable warning devices;

3.2.5 Fix a minimum speed limit in respect of any part of a street under construction or repair or in a state of disrepair applicable to all vehicles or any class of vehicle while travelling on that street and shall cause such street to be marked by signs and other suitable warning devices;

3.2.6 Impose temporary weight restrictions on street as may be necessary to protect the surface of the streets;

3.2.7 Designate any street, avenue, or alley within the Village of Rosemary as a “No Parking Zone” for the purpose of grading, snow removal, maintenance and repair as required, or for the purpose of a parade when authorized;

3.2.8 Authorize the holding of a parade or procession and shall provide a permit for same if he/she deems it in order. In the event the Chief Administrative Officer refuses to issue a permit for any reason, the applicants may apply to the Council who may, by resolution, direct the issue of such permit subject to the provisions of this Bylaw.

**4.0 GENERAL RULES**

- 4.1 No vehicle operator shall drive or stand a vehicle upon a highway in such a manner as to block, obscure, impede or hinder traffic thereon. Where the obstruction is unavoidable due to mechanical failure, the operator will not be in contravention of this section provided measures are promptly taken to clear the obstruction from the highway.
- 4.2 When the Chief Administrative Officer has caused any intersection to be marked by signs or otherwise indicating that right turns, left turns, U-turns, or any turns are prohibited, no operator of a vehicle shall make such prohibited turns.
- 4.3 Every person shall comply with any traffic signal or direction of a member of the School Patrol.
- 4.4 No operator of any vehicle shall drive over any sidewalk or boulevard except at a permanent or temporary driveway.
- 4.5 No vehicle with steel lugs or cleats may be operated or propelled on any paved or hard-surfaced street, land or roadway without prior approval of the Chief Administrative Officer or Designated Officer of the Village of Rosemary.
- 4.6 No operator of any vehicle shall fail to obey a traffic control device.
- 4.7 Where an unprotected hose of the Fire Department has been laid down on any street or driveway for use at a fire or alarm of a fire, no person shall drive any vehicle over such hose except with the consent of the Fire Department Official in command.
- 4.8 Where a newly painted line on any roadway is indicated by signs, flags, or other warning device, no person shall willfully drive or walk on or over such lines.
- 4.9 When repairs or alterations are in progress on or adjoining any roadway and such work is being indicated by barricades or signs or by a flagman, no person shall disregard the warning given thereby and every operator shall obey any signal of a flagman on duty at the site of the work.
- 4.10 When a vehicle is engaged in such roadway repairs or alterations within an area controlled by a flagman, the provisions of this Bylaw relating to backing, stopping, crossing the centre line and making other movements shall not apply to such vehicle.
- 4.11 No occupier of any premises shall permit the unobstructed flow of water from any such premises over any street, sidewalk, or boulevard.
- 4.12 No person shall, without authorization from the Village, deposit any earth, rocks, trees, or other substances or objects on any street, sidewalk, or boulevard within the Village, and if such deposits have been made without authorization and the Village removes the same, the expense therefore shall be chargeable to the person responsible, which shall be in addition to any fine or penalty imposed by this Bylaw.

- 4.13 Operators of motor vehicles and trailers used for the purpose of carrying waste materials and refuse must adequately enclose, secure, or cover the materials and prevent any portion of the load from falling or flowing onto any public or private property.
- 4.14 No person shall allow any materials to fall or blow onto any public or private property.
- 4.15 No person shall apply or engage engine retarder brakes on any truck in any part of the Village.
- 4.16 No person shall operate or park a School Bus, as defined by The Traffic Safety Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. T-6, School Bus Operation Regulation 437.86 as amended, in excess of 6.7 meters in overall length, off the Village of Rosemary Scheduled Truck Route except while transporting pupils to or from a school or school event or unless approval has been received from the Chief Administrative Officer. Form "A" will be used for this permission.
- 4.17 No person shall operate or park a Commercial Bus as defined by The Traffic Safety Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. T-6, Commercial Bus Equipment & Safety Regulation (213/2006) as amended, off the Village of Rosemary Scheduled Truck route except while picking up or dropping off bona fide passenger groups at non truck route locations.
- 4.18 No person shall allow any leaked spilled, or otherwise emitted fuel, solvents, other petroleum based products, or other liquids, including water to be leaked, spilled, or otherwise emitted onto any highway from any vehicle or container located on or in a vehicle.
- 4.19 Any leaked spilled, or otherwise emitted fuel, solvent or other petroleum based products or other liquids, including water may be subject to clean-up by the Village of Rosemary if they are not cleaned up to the satisfaction of the Chief Administrative Officer or his/her designate within twenty four (24) hours of the time of the leak, spill, or emission. Any costs for the clean up or repairs for damage caused will be payable by the registered owner of the vehicle involved in the leak, spill, or emission.
- 4.20 No person shall allow trees, hedges, or shrubs on private property within four (4) meters of a highway and/or highway intersection whether planted before or after the date of the passing of this Bylaw, to grow to such a width or height that good visibility for safe traffic flow is thereby interfered with.

## **5.0** **SPEED**

- 5.1 No person shall drive at a greater rate of speed than 40 kilometers per hour on any street or avenue within the Village of Rosemary.
- 5.2 No person shall drive at a greater rate of speed than 20 kilometers per hour in any alley or public parking area within the Village of Rosemary.
- 5.3 In designated Playground Zones within the Village of Rosemary, no person shall drive at a greater rate of speed than 30 kilometers per hour between the hours of 7 am and 9 pm.

- 5.3.1 The streets and avenues noted and marked on Schedule “B” of this By-law shall be designated playground zones within the Village of Rosemary.

## **6.0 TRUCK ROUTES AND WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS**

- 6.1 The streets and avenues noted and marked on Schedule “A” of this By-law shall be designated truck routes within the Village of Rosemary.
- 6.2 Except where specific exemptions are allowed in this By-law, no person shall operate or park a vehicle with a gross licensed vehicle weight exceeding 7500 kilograms on any street other than a street designated as a truck route in Schedule “A” of this By-law.
- 6.3 No person shall operate or park a vehicle, on any street, in excess of the weight and size limits established by the Public Service Vehicles Act of the Province of Alberta and regulations or amendments thereunder, without first obtaining a permit from the Chief Administrative Officer or Council. Form “A” will be used for this permission.
- 6.4 The following shall not be deemed to be operating a vehicle in contravention of this by-law, if the vehicle was being operated in the most direct and practical route between the premises or location concerned which is located off the truck route and nearest truck route.
- 6.4.1 Persons delivering or collecting goods or merchandise to or from the premises of bona fide customers.
- 6.4.2 Persons going to or from premises located in non-restrictive areas for the servicing or repairing of heavy equipment.
- 6.4.3 Persons pulling or removing a disabled vehicle on a street prohibited to a heavy vehicle.
- 6.4.4 Persons operating a vehicle owned by or in the service of the Village of Rosemary.
- 6.4.5 Persons operating a vehicle owned by or in the service of public utility companies covering electrical, natural gas, communications and water and sewer.

## **7.0 OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLES**

- 7.1 No person shall operate an Off-Highway vehicle, as defined in Act (Section 117) and amendments thereto, on any street, avenue or alley, boulevard, walking pathway, park or parking lot or any other public place, unless use is expressly permitted by the Chief Administrative Officer. In the event the Chief Administrative Officer refuses to issue a permit for any reason, the applicants may apply to the Council who may, by resolution, direct the issue of such permit subject to the provisions of this Bylaw. Form “B” will be used for this permission.

**8.0**    **PARKING**

- 8.1 No person shall park any truck, school bus, van trailer or combination thereof or any other vehicle exceeding the license gross weight of 7,500 kilograms on any residential street, avenue or ally within the Village of Rosemary, unless written permission has first been obtained from the Chief Administrative Officer. Form "A" will be used for this permission.
- 8.2 No person shall park a motor home, holiday trailer, a utility trailer or any other vehicle that is designed in such a way that it may be attached to or is attached to or drawn by a motor vehicle and is intended to transport property or persons, on any street, avenue or alley within the Village of Rosemary, for more than 48 consecutive hours, unless written permission has first been obtained from the Chief Administrative Officer. Form "A" will be used for this permission.
- 8.2.1 Notwithstanding Section 8.2, such vehicles may be parked on the portion of the boulevard adjacent and parallel to the occupant's and/or owner's property, provided that adequate space is available.
- 8.3 No person shall park any vehicle in an alley in a manner which will obstruct the full use of the alley by other vehicles, except for loading and unloading, and then only for a reasonable period of time.
- 8.4 No person shall park in a space provided for handicapped persons, unless the registered owner of the handicapped sticker is present in the vehicle when parked or being picked up.
- 8.5 The Chief Administrative Officer shall have the authority to designate any street, avenue or alley within the Village of Rosemary as a "No Parking Zone" for the purpose of grading, snow removal, maintaining or repairing as required, or for the purpose of a parade when authorized by the Chief Administrative Officer or Council of the Village of Rosemary.
- 8.6 No person shall wash any vehicle on any street in such a manner as to constitute a nuisance or hazard.
- 8.7 No person shall stand or park any vehicle on any street for the purpose of greasing or repairing such vehicle, except for emergency repairs.
- 8.8 Unless required or permitted by this Bylaw or the Act, as amended, or by a traffic control device, or in compliance with the direction of a Peace Officer, or to avoid conflict with other traffic, a driver shall not stop or park his vehicle:
- 8.8.1 On a sidewalk;
- 8.8.2 On a crosswalk or on any part of a crosswalk;
- 8.8.3 Within an intersection other than immediately next to the curb in a "T" intersection;
- 8.8.4 At an intersection nearer than 5 meters to the projection of the corner property line immediately ahead or immediately to the rear except when his/her vehicle is parked in

- a space where a parking meter or other traffic control device indicates parking is permitted;
- 8.8.5 Within 5 meters upon the approach to any stop sign or yield sign;
  - 8.8.6 Within 5 meters of any fire hydrant, or when the hydrant is not located at the curb, within 5 meters of the point on the curb nearest the hydrant;
  - 8.8.7 Within 1.5 meters of an access to a garage, private road or driveway, or a vehicle crossway over a sidewalk;
  - 8.8.8 Within 5 meters of the near side of a marked crosswalk;
  - 8.8.9 Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when the stopping or parking would obstruct traffic;
  - 8.8.10 At any other place where a traffic control device prohibits stopping or parking, during such times as stopping or parking is so prohibited;
  - 8.8.11 On the roadway side of a vehicle parked or stopped at the curb or edge of the roadway.
- 8.9 When parking on a roadway, a driver shall park his vehicle with the sides parallel to the curb edge of the roadway, and;
- 8.9.1 With the right hand wheels thereof not more than 500 millimeters from the right hand curb or edges of the roadway; or
  - 8.9.2 In the case of a one-way highway where parking on either side is permitted, with the wheels closest to a curb or edge of the roadway not more than 500 millimeters from the curb or edge and with the vehicle facing the direction of travel authorized for that highway.
- 8.10 When a sign indicates that angle parking, as defined in the Regulations of the Act, is permitted or required and parking guide lines are visible on the roadway, a driver shall park his/her vehicle:
- 8.10.1 With its sides between and parallel to any 2 of the guide lines; and
  - 8.10.2 With one front wheel not more than 500 millimeters from the curb or edge of the roadway.
- 8.11 When a sign indicating that angle parking, as defined in the Regulations of the Act, is permitted or required but no parking guidelines are visible on the roadway, a driver shall park his vehicle
- 8.11.1 With its' sides at an angle of between 30 and 60 degrees to the curb or edge of the roadway; and

- 8.11.2 With one front wheel not more than 500 millimeters from the curb or edge of the roadway.

## **9.0 BACKING**

- 9.1 No person shall back across the centre line or the centre of a roadway for the purpose of proceeding in a direction other than the direction in which the vehicles are required to move prior to the act of backing up.

## **10.0 CAMPING**

- 10.1 No person shall occupy or permit any other person to occupy a mobile unit upon any street, avenue, alley, parking lot or public property within the Village of Rosemary, unless such property has been designated for use as a mobile unit park or trailer court or otherwise authorized by the Chief Administrative Officer or Council.

- 10.2 For the purpose of this Section “mobile unit” means:

10.2.1 Any vacation trailer, horse trailer or retractable trailer, or

10.2.2 Any structure whether ordinarily equipped with wheels or not, that is constructed or manufactured to be moved from one point to another by being lowered or carried and to provide living accommodation for or other use by one or more persons.

## **11.0 BICYCLES**

- 11.1 In this section “cycle” shall mean a bicycle.

- 11.2 No person over the age of 6 years, shall drive a cycle on any sidewalk, footpath, or boulevard except where expressly permitted to do so by this Bylaw.

- 11.3 In addition to any penalty provided in this Bylaw, a Peace Officer may impound any bicycle used or operated in contravention of this Bylaw for a period not to exceed seven (7) days for the first offence, fourteen (14) days for the second offense and thirty (30) days for the third and subsequent offenses.

## **12.0 INFLAMMABLE AND EXPLOSIVE MATERIAL**

- 12.1 No truck equipped for carrying gasoline, propane or other inflammable substance, or explosive substances, loaded or unloaded, shall be left unattended on any street, avenue or ally within the Village of Rosemary.

**13.0 LITTER AND DUMPING CONTROL**

- 13.1 No person shall place or deposit in any parking lot, alley, laneway, or roadway, except in garbage receptacles, any paper, cardboard, glass, or any other litter offensive or injurious to any other person using such areas.
- 13.2 No person shall deposit or dump in any parking lot, alley, laneway, or roadway, soil products, snow, or any other refuse or debris which may obstruct vehicles or pedestrians, or cause damage to such areas and/or be offensive or injurious to any other person using such areas.
- 13.3 No person shall contaminate by placing, depositing, or allowing to enter any litter, refuse, or substance or material of any sort in any alley, laneway, or roadway.
- 13.4 If refuse, garbage and/or any material not specifically intended for the collection is disposed of from a vehicle and it cannot be determined who is the operator disposing of the waste, the registered owner of the vehicle shall be deemed to be the person who disposed of the waste.

**14.0 PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT**

- 14.1 A Peace Officer is for the purposes of enforcement of this Bylaw, is a Designed Officer of the Village.
- 14.2 Any person who contravenes any provision of the Bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable upon summary conviction, to a specified penalty for that offence as set out in Schedule "C" to this Bylaw.
- 14.3 A Peace Officer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue Violation Tags to any person who the Peace Officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe has contravened any provision of this Bylaw.
- 14.4 A Violation Tag may be issued to such Person;
- 14.4.1 Either personally; or
- 14.4.2 By mailing a copy of such Person at his or her last-known post office address.
- 14.5 A Violation Tag issued pursuant to this Bylaw shall be in a form approved by the Chief Administrative Officer and shall state;
- 14.5.1 The name of the person;
- 14.5.2 The offence;
- 14.5.3 The appropriate penalty for the offence and specified in Schedule "C" of this Bylaw;
- 14.5.4 The time period in which the specified penalty must be paid in order to avoid prosecution for the alleged offence; and

- 14.5.5 Any other information as may be required by the Chief Administrative Officer.
- 14.6 Where a Violation Tag has been issued pursuant to this Bylaw, the person to whom the Violation Tag has been issued may, in lieu of being prosecuted for the offence, pay to the Village, the penalty specified on the Violation Tag.
- 14.7 In those cases where a Violation Tag has been issued and the penalty specified on the Violation Tag has not been paid within the prescribed time, a Peace Officer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue a Violation Ticket.
- 14.8 A Peace Officer is authorized and empowered to immediately issue a Violation Ticket to any person whom the Peace Officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe is responsible for a contravention of this Bylaw.
- 14.9 A Violation Ticket issued with respect to a contravention of this Bylaw shall be served upon the person responsible for the contravention in accordance with the Provincial Offences Procedure Act.
- 14.10 The person to whom the Violation Ticket may, in the cases of a Violation Ticket issued pursuant to Part II of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act, plead guilty by making a voluntary payment in respect to the summons by delivering to the Provincial Court, on or before the initial appearance date, the Violation Ticket together with an amount equal to the specified penalty for the offence as provided for in Schedule "C" to this Bylaw.
- 14.11 When a clerk of the Provincial Court records the receipt of a voluntary payment pursuant to Section 14.10 and the Provincial Offences Procedure Act, the act of recording constitutes acceptance of the guilty plea and also constitutes the conviction and imposition of a fine in the amount of the specified penalty.
- 14.12 A Peace Officer is hereby authorized to remove or cause to be removed any vehicle:
- 14.12. That is parked in contravention of this Bylaw;
- 14.12.2 That is not registered under the Act.
- 14.13 Any vehicle removed pursuant to this Bylaw shall be removed to a place designated by the Chief Administrative Officer where it shall remain until claimed by its owner or agent or until disposed of under the provisions of the Act.
- 14.14 No impounded vehicle shall be released to its owner or agent until payment of the costs incurred for removal of the vehicle, storage of the vehicle and administration is received by the Village of Rosemary or its agent. Such charge shall be in addition to any fines or penalty imposed in respect of any such violation, or to any payment made in lieu of prosecution as provided for in this Bylaw.

**15.0 FORMS AND SCHEDULES**

15.1 Forms and Schedules to this Bylaw may be amended from time to time, by resolution of Council.

**16.0 SEVERABILITY**

16.1 Should any provision of this Bylaw be found invalid, the invalid provision shall be severed and the remaining Bylaw shall be maintained.

**17.0 REPEAL OF BYLAW**

17.1 That the following Bylaws and all amendments be hereby repealed, 297/98, 310/98 and 318/99.

**18.0 EFFECTIVE DATE**

18.1 This Bylaw shall take effect at the date of final passing thereof.

READ a first time this 6 day of September, 2011.

READ a second time this 6 day of September, 2011.

READ a third time and finally passed this 3 day of October, 2011.

**PLAYGROUND ZONES**

1. Gwen Avenue East: from Highway #550 to Dahlia Street.
2. Dahlia Street: from Gwen Avenue East to Lupin Avenue.
3. Lupin Avenue: from Dahlia Street to Centre Street.
- 4, Centre Street: from Railway Avenue to Gwen Avenue West.
